




What is in the library?

The N.C. Department of Labor Library collection includes approximately 14,000 volumes, 80 periodical titles, and over 600 video titles. The library provides a quiet work area for study and research. Businesses, safety consultants, lawyers, state employees and students use the library services for a variety of needs. There is a computer available with Internet connection for patrons who need to access the video database.

Print: The nearly 14,000-volume collection has labor-related print and video material. Topics covered include occupational safety and health, labor law, boiler safety, toxicology, etc.

Most print and video titles are in the online catalog of the State Library of North Carolina and can be searched at: <http://go.dcr.state.nc.us/>



Videos: The library lends videos from its collection of over 650 occupational safety and health titles (over 1,500 volumes). A list of the titles in the collection is on the department's Web page (www.nclabor.com, click on "Library" in "Quick Clicks"). Videos and DVDs may be borrowed for three weeks at a time. Contact the library to request videos and DVDs.

Electronic resources: The library subscribes to specialized databases that may be accessed from the library terminals. The librarian can also assist with locating information on the Internet.

Research assistance: The librarian can draw from both print and electronic resources to provide you with the information you need.

Orientations: The librarian will provide tours of the library. Please make an appointment.

Obtain resources: The librarian will send articles and excerpts of materials to you via fax or email when possible. If you would like to borrow a particular book, contact the library staff.

Library home page: The library's home page includes a list of videos and basic information for the public: www.nclabor.com and click on "Library" in the "Quick Clicks" box.

Visit: You are welcome to visit the library at any time. If you plan to do research, call ahead to ensure that a staff member will be available to assist you with your information needs.
